CALL FOR PAPERS ECONOMIC TRANSFERS

We would like to present topics related to the broadly understood problem of transfers and flows in the economics, which include transfer of goods, ideas and technologies and economic migrations of peoples in history. We want to deal with the relations in the regional, national and international perspective, seeking answers on the role played by transfers in social and economic life from the institutional and human point of view. The issues put forward open up a wide spectrum of research problems, including e.g.: the impact of transfers on the international labor division, broadly understood modernization, the impact of transfers on the ways of economic development, ect. Other areas may relate to the role of particular participants of transfers: recipients and consumers, innovators, bridges that help to spread the goods, ideas, technologies and people.

We propose the following list of issues, stating that we are open to other proposals in the research areas that interest us:

- transfer of goods;
- transfer of ideas and technologies;
- transfer (migration) of people;
- financial transfers (e.g. capital, cash flows, investments);
- economic cross-border relations (e.g. cross-border trade, smuggling);
- transfers as a factor of social and economic modernization;
